4	MR. LAURANS: Yes. Can we approach briefly?
5	I think I got my last few.
6	Judge, I'd ask that 23 and 26
. 7	MR. KELLY: No objection.
8	THE COURT: Exhibits 23 and 26 are received.
9	MR. LAURANS: And I believe that's it, other
10	than affidavits, which I have a witness.
11	THE COURT: I understand.
12	MR. LAURANS: Judge, my next witness will be
13	Cliff Middleton.
14	Would you please stand and be sworn, please.
15	CLIFTON LEE MIDDLETON, being sworn by the Court, testified:
16	DIRECT EXAMINATION by MR. LAURANS:
17	Q Could you please state your name and address for the
18	record?
19	A Clifton Lee Middleton.
20	Q Are you related to Ken Middleton?
21	A Yes, I'm his son.
22	Q Mr. Middleton, prior to February 12, 1990, had you been
23	in your father's house?
24	A Yes.
25	Q Was there a telephone in the dining room?

- 1 A Yes.
- Q Was there a boot print on a wall?
- 3 A Yes.
- Q Can you tell me where the boot print was?
- 5 A Right next to the door, up on the wall.
- 6 0 Which door?
- 7 A The back door.
- 8 0 Was that boot --
- 9 A It was actually the phone was here and the door -- you know, I'm just -- for example, was over here, and it was just off of it there.
- 12 Q All right.
- 13 A There was like a plant and a statue there.
- 14 Q If you're facing the wall, the phone was on the left,
  15 correct?
- 16 A Correct.
- 17 | Q And the boot print was a little bit to the right?
- 18 A Exactly.
- 20 About how -- what was the distance between the phone and the boot print?
- 21 A Just guessing, I would say if the phone was here, it
  22 was in here somewhere.
- 23 Q About four to five feet away?
- 24 A Yeah. Four feet, I would say.
- 25 Q Was the boot print there prior to February 12, 1990?

- 1 A Yes, it was.
- 2 Q I'm sorry. February 11, 1990?
- 3 A Yes, February 12.
- Q All right. It was there prior?
- 5 A Yes.
  - Q About how long prior? Do you remember?
- A At least two weeks, because I was there in mid to late

  January and it was there then.
- 9 Q Did you notice the boot print then?
- 10 A Yes.
- 11 Q Did you inquire about it?
- 12 A Yeah, I asked my dad. I was on the phone and I had

  13 noticed it. I said, "What happened here?" And he said

  14 that someone played a joke on him and he had kicked the

  15 wall.
- 16 Q What was the joke? Do you remember?
- A My dad's always been afraid of snakes, and at the time

  I just assumed that someone had threw a stick or a

- 21 A Yes.
- 22 Q Did you ever tell Mr. Duncan about the boot print?
- 23 A Yes.
- 24 Q Were you available to testify at that trial?
- 25 A Yes, I was.

1 1	Q Did you ever tell Mr. Duncan that you didn't want to
2	testify?
3	A No, I didn't.
4	MR. LAURANS: I don't have any further
5 -	questions.
6	THE COURT: Cross?
7	MR. KELLY: No, Your Honor.
8	THE COURT: Very well. Can this witness be
9	excused?
10	MR. LAURANS: Yes, Your Honor.
11	MR. KELLY: Yes, Your Honor.
12	THE COURT: Thank you. You may step down.
13	You are excused.
14	THE WITNESS: Thank you.
